

The Iowa 19th Regiment in the Civil War - Injuries and Deaths

The 19th of Iowa Regiment in the Civil War was that to which Isham Thomas (Jr.) served. He was injured. He was married to Mary Jane Strobe September 23, 1863; possibly he was released earlier than the regiment's 1865 mustering out date.
